
Welcome

Welcome to the South West Sheepdog Club's Trans-Tasman Sheepdog Trial. It's an exciting time for our club as we continue to grow and this is our first trial in the lovely town of Edenhope, in the West Wimmera Shire. We'd like to give you an idea of what you can expect over the next few days.

About

The Trans-Tasman Sheepdog Trial is a competition which involves handler, dog, 3 sheep and 4 obstacles. Australian and New Zealand rules are incorporated into a course, designed to create a level playing field for when both countries compete. This year, Australia is hosting the official Australia/New Zealand competition in Campbell Town, Tasmania, from 15 - 23 October. In Edenhope this weekend, you will be able to watch some of Australia's best sheepdogs and handlers, many of whom will be competing in Campbell Town later this year.

The Trial Course





How the Trial Works

Each Competitor starts with 100 points, and 15 minutes to complete the course. Points are deducted along the way for imperfect work. Look at the course diagram opposite and we will try to "walk" you around:

- The handler must stand and wait at the **Casting Peg** with their dog stopped, waiting for the bell which signals the start of their 15 minutes.
- 3 Sheep (randomly selected) are **Let Out** at the opposite end of the field, and the Judge will ring the bell, and the timeclock is now running.
- The dog is **Cast** and must go out and around behind the sheep, then deliver them as directly as possible to the handler (the Lift and Draw). The Handler cannot move from the **Casting Peg** until the sheep have been delivered on the left hand side of the handler.
- Once this first phase is completed, the handler walks towards the **Gap** maintaining a constant pace while the dog brings the sheep. Sheep are put through the **Gap**, and the Handler must then follow. This first section was under Australian rules. From the Gap, the New Zealand rules apply, and you will notice some key differences in how the handler can work their dog.
- The handler now proceeds to the **Maltese Cross**, with dog and handler driving the sheep. The handler can stop, can quicken or slow their pace and the handler may assist their dog, but both dog and handler must remain behind the sheep in order to not loose points.
- At the **Maltese Cross**, the sheep enter and exit from the direction of the **Gap**, then enter and exit through the other arm, moving in the direction of the **Bridge.** Any other course will be wrong, and the handler and their dog must re-work the obstacle until they do it in the correct order.
- All going well, the handler and dog move the sheep to the **Bridge**, putting the sheep over the **Bridge** with the handler still able to assist the dog. Once the sheep go over the bridge, the New Zealand rules end, and the last section of the course is once again under the Australian rules.
- The handler, sheep and dog proceed to the **Pen**. The sheep are directed into the **Pen**, and the handler must shut the gate closed to complete the Trial. The sheep must all be in the pen when the gate is shut.



Protecting the welfare of all involved

The South West Sheepdog Club are committed to the welfare of the sheep, dogs and workers – this is an extremely important element of this event. As always, we ask and expect our competitors to respect the generosity of the owner of the sheep and to treat all the stock with utmost care.

150 years of Sheepdog Trials

In 2022, the sport of sheepdog trialling in Australia will be celebrating 150 years of heritage and tradition. Sheep dog trials have been part of the Australian pastoral history with the first trials held in the world in Australia in the early 1870's. The handlers realised that these events brought together owners and breeders in a convivial atmosphere to discuss those matters relating to the breeding, training, feeding, care and development of their canine charges. Since that time, trial objectives, which are for the betterment of breeding, work and treatment of the sheep dog, have not changed.

The working sheepdog is an essential component of the Australian pastoral industry, you will find them wherever sheep run. Australia has over 90,000 livestock producers¹ each of whom employs an average of three working dogs to assist with their stock handling requirements².

The many thousands of dogs working on a daily basis make an enormous contribution to the efficiency of livestock management in Australia's large agricultural sector, which is responsible for approximately 30% of GDP³. The \$ value of the work these dogs perform in primary production is undefined but would run to \$millions annually. On properties they are the stock man and woman's constant companion and highly valued assistant. In most cases it would be impossible to manage livestock without them.

Schedule of Events

Trial commences 7.30am Friday 12th August with Round 1 of the main draw. Once Round 1 is completed, the competition will move straight onto Round 2. Competition will continue until end of the day. Saturday 13th August – trial recommences at 7.30am and moves on through Rounds 3 and 4. It is hoped by the end of Saturday we will complete all 4 rounds and the finalists will be determined.

Sunday 14th August - Finals Competitions, plus the Farmers' Trial starting at 12.30pm and running on a modified course. This schedule is a guide only, times can vary. Listen out for the announcer during each day for schedule updates or changes.
