

What to do in a fire, flood or other emergency

Quick guide for facilities and services

When are warnings issued?

Stay alert to emergencies affecting your community. Emergency Management Victoria issues emergency warnings if an emergency is occurring that may threaten life or property.

Advice



There is an emergency in your local area, access information and monitor conditions.

Watch and act



Fire or flood is heading towards you, conditions are changing and you need to take action now to protect your safety and wellbeing and that of your residents and staff.

Emergency warning



You are in imminent danger and need to take immediate action. You will be impacted by fire or flood.

Reacting to warning messages
