LOCATION OF TREE: 51-53 Lake Street, Edenhope

SPECIES OF TREE: Desert Ash x 2

REASON FOR REQUEST: Becoming old and dangerous. One large limb fell into the property last year. Hampers further development of block.

RECOMMENDATION: These large ash trees are located on the nature strip adjacent No. 51-53 Lake Street Edenhope and are estimated to be approximately 40+ years old. The trees in question are very well established and provide valuable street amenity and shade in summer.

The trees are situated midway between the concrete footpath and the kerb & channel and is in general alignment with other street trees. The trees do not prevent access to the property via the existing crossovers in the kerb & channel.

The trees are not under power lines.

The reasons for removal don't fall within the tree removal criteria in Council's Street Tree Policy. It is recommended that the trees do not be removed.

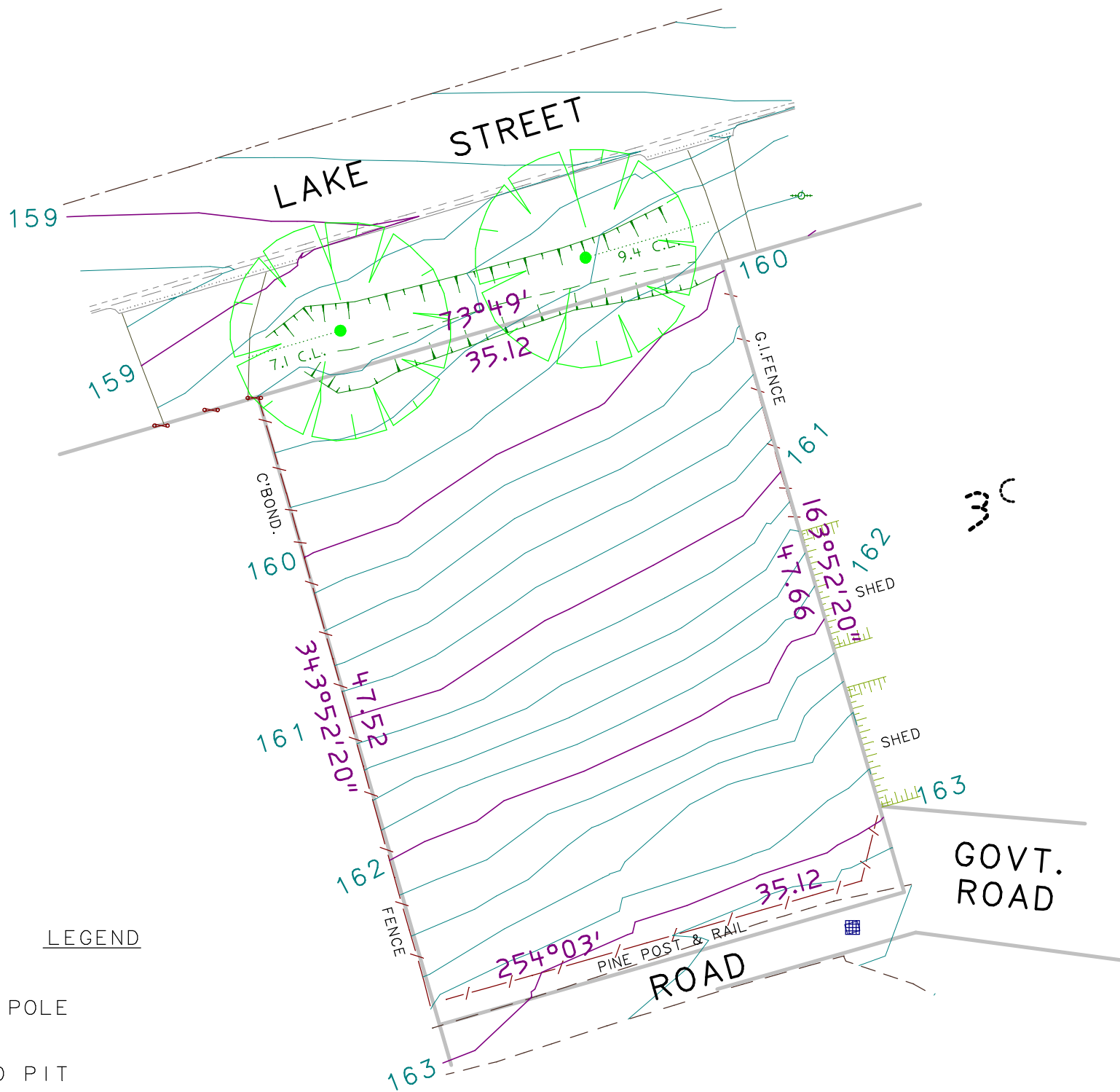

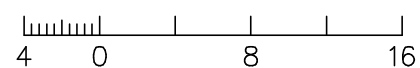

Dear Chief Executive Officer

The Minister for Local Government is required to annually review the current amounts, limits and ranges of mayoral and councillor allowances to determine whether an 'adjustment factor' should be applied.

The Minister has conducted this review under section 73B of the *Local Government Act 1989* and determined that, this year, no adjustment to allowances will be made in respect of all councils.

The Minister had regard to the Victorian Premier's recent decision determining a zero per cent adjustment to Victorian Public Service executive remuneration for the 2020-21 financial year.

Councils will therefore continue to pay mayors and councillors the same allowance amounts that applied prior to the current general elections.
